York 50+ Festival Saturday 20 September to Wednesday 1 October 2025

As plans come together for the York 50+ Festival - a unique, 10-day event featuring an exciting mix of talks, performances and social activities - organisers York Older People's Assembly (YOPA) and Age UK York share some news of what is in store.

Celebrating its 20th year, the festival embraces the UN designated International Day of Older People (IDOP) and runs from **Saturday 20 September to Wednesday 1 October**, with a Central Parade on Saturday 27 September. The festival is an invitation to actively participate in York's vibrant community and offers a space to challenge ageism and celebrate the energy, creativity, and contributions of older people.
